

# Milford Primary School - Pupil Premium Statement 2015-2016

## What is it?

The Pupil Premium is funding allocated to schools for the specific purpose of boosting the attainment of pupils from low-income families. Funding is based on children who have registered for a free school meal at any point in the last 6 years, or have a parent who works in the Forces or a child that has been in care for more than six months. Governors monitor the spending of the Pupil Premium budget and the impact to pupils in receipt of the funding. The governor responsible for monitoring Pupil Premium money, together with the Headteacher, is Ruth Baker. Training and conferences are attended by the Headteacher and governors to maximize the learning opportunities for this group of children. Governors continually keep abreast of developments regarding Pupil Premium funding.

## Why has it been introduced?

The Government believes that the Pupil Premium, which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) and their wealthier peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most. Whilst schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit, we are required to publish online information about how we have used the Premium.

In the financial year 2015-2016 the Pupil Premium grant for this school was £20,960. The percentage of pupils eligible for free school meals now (September 14) and in the last 6 years is 20.5 plus two looked after children. We have continued to embed the good practice from the previous year by allocating the funding to:

- Nurture and Wellbeing support
- Reading intervention
- After school homework clubs
- Support payment of after school sports clubs
- Targeted intervention through group work
- 1:1 support
- Precision teaching support for identified groups
- Support payment of residential trips
- Wider Opportunities instrument tuition
- Behaviour support visits
- Booster groups for Year 6 and Year 2 children with an experienced teacher
